Shape: Stand in front of a mirror. Make sure that your head is straight. Can you see the white of your eyes either above or below your iris's (aka the colored part of your eye)? If no, then you have an almond eye shape. If yes, then you have a round eye shape.

- Almond: Almond shaped eyes are named so because the opening of the eye looks like the shape of an almond. They are more angular, and sometimes categorized as being a sharp feature.
- Round: Round eyes are often referred to as "doe eyes". Of course, round eyes will still have a slight slant.

Size: The size of your eyes is the combination of the vertical and horizontal measurement. Most of the time you should be able to look at your eyes and tell if they are large or small. If they seem like neither then they are most likely average. **Situation**: "The situation" is what I'm using to define the relationship between your brow bone and eye lids.

- Monolid: Typical for Asians. The fold of the eye is at the lash line and there is not a prominent brow bone. Which means there is no crease in the eye lid area at all.
- **Hooded**: Does not have very much visible eye lid when the eye is open. There is typically a prominent brow bone and the skin from the brow bone covers the eyelid.
- Crease: Which means that you can see your eyelid when your eyes are open. As long as your eyes aren't prominent/protruding then you qualify as having a visible crease.
- Deep Set: Has a strong brow bone all the way across the top of the eye, but they don't have the "overhang" in the outer third like the hooded eye has. With deep set eyes, it's as if the eyes are further back in the skull. They are often misjudged as hooded.
- **Prominent**: Commonly called protruding eyes, are the opposite of deep set eyes. They usually have a "lower lid" (aka a crease under the eye but not the tear trough), and they sit more on the outside of the eye socket area.

Setting: Look at where your eyes are set/sitting in relation to each other.

- Average: This means that the distance between your eyes is equal to the length of one of your eyes. This is a very proportional setting.
- Wide Set: This means your eyes have more distance between the eyes.
- Close Set: This means that your eyes have less distance between the eyes.

Position: If you drew a line straight across your eyes where do the outer corner of your eyes go? Above the line would mean that you have upturned eyes. Below the line would mean that you have downturned eyes. Lastly, if your eyes are pretty close to that straight line then they are straight.

Based on the skin's reaction to sun exposure, skin tones is classified into 6 basic categories:

- Type I: Light skin that always burns and never tans.
- Type II: Fair skin that usually burns, then tans.
- Type III: Medium skin that may burn, but tans well.
- Type IV: Olive skin that rarely burns and tans well.
- Type V: Tan brown skin that very rarely burns and tans well.
- Type VI: Black brown skin that never burns and tans very well.

Variances in each of these 6 basic classifications of skin tone occur in the form of skin undertones. Whether you have very fair or dark skin, there is an undertone to your coloring that is either warm, cool or neutral.

- Warm Undertones: The veins on the insides of your wrists have a purple-bluish hue, you look best in gold jewelry and your skin tends to get a golden or honey color from sun exposure.
- Cool Undertones: The veins on the insides of your wrists have a green-bluish hue, you
 look best in silver jewelry and your skin tends to burn or gets a rosy color from sun
 exposure.
- Neutral Undertones: It's hard to tell if the veins on the insides of your wrists appear
 more purple or green, gold and silver jewelry are equally complementary and you tan
 as well as burn from sun exposure.

Skin types refer to the condition or feel of your skin. Skin types vary based on water content, oil content and sensitivity. Regardless of skin tone and undertones, just about everyone's skin can be categorized based on these factors.

- **Normal Skin**: Not too oily or too dry with few or no imperfections, an even complexion and no sensitivity.
- **Combination Skin**: Can be oily in some areas, like the T-zone, and dry in others with overly dilated pores and a shiny complexion.
- **Oily Skin**: Oily all over with enlarged pores and a thick, shiny complexion that is prone to blackheads and breakouts.
- Dry Skin: Allover dryness with a rough, reddish complexion, almost no visible pores, less elasticity and more visible lines.
- Sensitive Skin: Easily irritated skin that shows up in the form of redness, itching, burning or dryness.

Oval

Oval faces are the most proportional out of all the shapes so just about any type of haircut and facial hair style can be pulled off. The Oval face shape is slightly longer than it is wide, with the jaw being slightly narrower than the cheekbones and having more rounded curves to the sides of your face

Oblong

Rectangular faces are characterized by a much longer and narrower face structure. Your chin has a very slight curve, with your forehead, cheeks and jawline being about the same width. If the jawline is angular, it may be referred to as a rectangular face.

Square

With a square face, the sides of your face are straight and your jawline is more angled with a slightly rounded chin. Your face is nearly as wide as it is long (hence the square shape) with a square forehead.

Triangular

The triangle-shaped face is the opposite of the heart-shaped face, with a slimmer forehead and a wider, squarer jaw and chin. Hairline has a lot to do with this face shape, as those with a curving hairline that comes to a point often have more triangular features.

Round

Round faces are very similar to square-shaped faces, just with softer more rounded angles. The sides of your face curves outward slightly instead of straight. The chin is rounded and your cheekbones are slightly wider than the other features of your face.

Diamond

Diamond shaped faces are characterized by having much higher and wider cheekbones with a more pointed and narrow chin. You would also have a narrower hairline (which is the main difference when compared to the heart shaped face).

Heart Shaped

Heart shaped faces are very similar to the diamond face with one main difference, the hairline (forehead) is much wider. The cheekbones are still the widest feature of the face, with the chin having being more pointed and narrow.

Uneven Lips

When one side of the upper lips is not entirely symmetrical with the other. Gives a mouth an almost natural smile

Large or Full Lips

Considered the most attractive due to their natural pout. Both upper and lower lips are thick and symmetrical

Drooping or Downturned Lips

Corner of the mouth are naturally downturned

Thin Lips

No defined cupid's bow. Thin upper and lower lips.

Flat Upper Lip

When upper lip has an undefined or no cupid's bow at all

Full Upper Lip

The upper lip is full and well defined while the lower is average or thin

Full Lower Lip

The lower lip is full and plump while the upper lip is average or thin and well defined

Heart Shaped Lips

Striking and attractive cupid's bow and full lower lip are the characteristics that make this type of lips shape noticeable and give it it's heart shape

Wide Lips

Considered a generous mouth. A dominating feature

Roman Nose

The Roman nose is one of the most attractive kinds among men and women. It is straight, almost flawless, and ends with a soft curvy tip. It is synonymous with the Aquiline nose.

Snub Nose

This nose is small, sloping upward at the tip, so that the nostrils are visible. These types of nose shapes are generally smaller in size and they tend to be turned up too.

Celestial Nose

The Celestial nose is a pretty one with a subtle upturned tip. This Tinkerbell-like nose is quite an angelic feature.

Hawk Nose

The hawk nose is so called because it is very convex, to the extent that it almost looks like a bow. It is very thin and sharp as well. Since it resembles the beak of a Hawk, it is known as the hawk nose.

Fleshy Nose

The Fleshy nose is a large feature with an excess of 'flesh' that makes up its bulk.

Greek Nose

This type of nose is perfectly straight with no curves or hooked like shape.

Nubian Nose

This type of nose has wide nostrils. It is generally a little narrow at the top, thick and broad at the middle and wide at the end.

Bumpy Nose

This nose is marked by its bumpy outline, with either a subtle or prominent curve in the dip.























Mesomorph Ectomorph

The endomorph tends to gain weight and keep it on. Their build is a little wider than an ectomorph or mesomorph, with a thick ribcage, wide hips, and shorter limbs.

Endomorph

- Blocky
- Thick rib cage
- Soft and round body
- Gains muscle and fat very easily
- Is generally short
- "Stocky" build
- Round physique
- Finds it hard to lose fat
- Slow metabolism
- Muscles not so well defined

The mesomorph tends to have wide shoulders, a narrow waist, relatively thin joints, and round muscle bellies.

- Generally hard body
- Well defined muscles
- Rectangular shaped body
- Strong
- Gains muscle easily
- Gains fat more easily than ectomorphs


An ectomorph tends to be thin, and struggles to gain

thin, and struggles to gain weight as either body fat or muscle. They can eat piles of food and stay looking the same.

Ectomorphs tends to have a lean build, long limbs, and small muscle bellies.

Body Shapes



Rectangle (40 per cent)

- Your chest, hips and waist are about the same width
- Your torso shape is straight

Triangle (14 per cent)

- You are bottom heavy
- Your chest is narrower than your hips
- Your lower body is heavier than your upper body
- You probably also have a sloping shoulder line

Trapezoid (13 per cent)

- Your shoulders and chest are broad
- Your waist and hips are medium
 -narrow
- Your upper torso is bigger than your lower torso
- You are well-proportioned
- This is known as the perfect male body shape.

Oval (26 per cent)

This shape appears round, particularly in the stomach area. This often results in narrower shoulders and slimness in the lower leg.

- Your overall appearance is round
- · You have a large stomach


Inverted Triangle (5 per cent)

Like the trapezoid, the v-shaped body or inverted triangle has broad shoulders and chest but narrower

Your shoulders and chest are broad

Inverted Triangle

Straight and squared shoulder line, little definition between waist/hips, flat hips and bottom and a bottom half that seems smaller than your top half.

Lean Column

Narrow shoulders, flat chest or small bust, small and non-defined waist, narrow hips and a flat bottom.

- Narrow hips and flat bottom
- "supermodel body type"
- Small to average sized breasts

Rectangle

Straight shoulder line, straight hips and bottom, Very little waist definition, Straight ribcage.

- Your hips and bust are balanced
- You probably have a bottom that is more flat than round
- You tend to gain weight in your torso first and then your upper thighs and arms
- Your lower legs are always shapely and one of your best assets

Apple

Rounded shoulder line, curved back, fullness around the middle and a flattish bottom

- You are generally well-proportioned
- Your shoulders are broader than your hips
- You are not necessarily as curvy through your hips
- You don't have a well-defined waistline

Pear | Full h

Full hips or thighs, a defined waist, shoulders that may slope and are narrower than your hips and a top half that appears small.

- Your hips are larger than your bust
- Your arms and shoulders appear proportionately slimmer

Neat Hour Glass A defined bust, a defined waist, a neat bottom and neat hips.

Full Hour Glass

A full bust, a small waist, a rounded bottom and rounded hips.

^{***} These body types aren't set in stone. In fact, most guys have a combination of two body types. These combinations are either ectomorph/mesomorph or mesomorph/endomorph.
